## General Information

4-H Exploration Days is an annual Michigan State University pre-college program that will take place June 18 to 20, 2025, on the MSU campus in East Lansing. The event draws about 1,000 participants aged 12 to 19 from across Michigan who can choose from a multitude of hands-on learning sessions, field trips, and recreation opportunities. During 4-H Exploration Days you'll have a chance to develop valuable skills, make new friends, get involved in lots of fun activities, and much more. You can choose from more than 100 action-packed sessions on topics that interest you! We hope you can come!

## NEW FOR 2025: Campus Career Connect Tracks

4-H Exploration Days has always been about helping you learn new things, meet new people, build skills in areas that interest you, have fun, and get a taste of life on MSU's campus. This year we've added Campus Career Connect (C3) tracks to help you start making connections and choices related to your future world of work. On Wednesday afternoon you'll attend a C3 track session that explores job and career options in fields like animal science, forestry, language arts, and public safety. You'll connect with MSU experts and find out about jobs in their fields, the education and training you'll need for those jobs, and MSU's programs in that area.

## Fees

The registration fee for young people and adults to participate in 4-H Exploration Days covers meals from Wednesday lunch to Friday lunch, two nights of lodging, all event activities, and a T-shirt.

- **\$250 for youth participants.**
- **\$150 for adult participants**—Adults attend to support this event as instructors and chaperones and will be assigned a variety of volunteer tasks.
- **\$45 Tuesday Early Arrival Fee**—This fee covers Tuesday lodging and Wednesday breakfast for long-distance participants (primarily from the Upper Peninsula).

Registration will open at 7 p.m. on March 20, 2025, and will close at 5 p.m. on April 25, 2025.

## Campus Career Connect Track Sessions

T-1	<b>Agriculture + Business + Management = Opportunities</b>	Join undergraduate students and faculty from the MSU Department of Agricultural, Food, and Resource Economics to test your skills in a fun, exciting, and team-building marshmallow tower challenge! Learn about agribusiness management and what strengths and skills you will need for a successful career in the field. Hear from current undergraduate students about the internship and study abroad opportunities that have helped them prepare to become effective leaders who make lasting impacts in the bioeconomy and beyond.
T-2	<b>Broad Art Museum: Explore a Future With Culture, Community &amp; the Arts</b>	In which Batman movie does MSU's Broad Art Museum appear? (Hint: Another superhero gets equal billing in the title.) Inside the unique architecture of the building awaits community, culture, heritage, and the arts. You'll learn about the skills you'll need to work in such an organization, explore interactive exhibits, and learn about the types of jobs and careers that are available in working to preserve and share the past, present, and future.
T-3	<b>Elements of Science</b>	Get an inside look at the FRIB—MSU's Facility for Rare Isotope Beams. Learn about jobs and careers related to nuclear science and chemistry. Explore the facilities on campus that are doing state-of-the-art science research!
T-4	<b>Explore Biosystems Engineering</b>	Biosystems engineers draw on biology, engineering, math, and other scientific disciplines to solve problems related to health, food, energy, and the environment. They analyze agricultural, ecological, and human systems to create ideas and solutions to address global problems. Learn from faculty and staff about the tools, techniques, and related jobs and career opportunities.
T-5	<b>Finding Your Field: Careers in Animal Science</b>	Are you interested in a job or career with animals but not sure how to get there? Join 4-H educators and MSU Department of Animal Science faculty, staff, and students to explore species, fields of study, and the exciting world of animal science.
T-6	<b>A Food-Focused Future</b>	Explore MSU's food science and human nutrition majors and learn about exciting job and career options. Be ready to engage your tastebuds and join us for a variety of hands-on experiences related to nutrition and food science!

Jobs and careers in research will also be shared.
