Michigan 4-H partners with MSU's Women's Leadership Institute to energize women leaders

Every day, in every way, women are leaders. To learn more about female leadership, 21 youth gathered together on September 24 to attend the Michigan State University (MSU) [Women's Leadership Institute](#) (WLI). An annual event now in its fourth consecutive year, the WLI is designed to empower women students with leadership aspirations.



A collaborative effort between MSU's College of Social Science, MSU alumni, professional women and students, the WLI seeks to ignite the passion of women leaders. Among the institute's executive board is Dr. Amy Bonomi, director of children and youth programming for MSU Extension. Bonomi worked to include high-school students for the first time in this year's event.

"One of the 2019 WLI themes was 'we're never not leaders' and we know youth are leaders in their own communities, every day," said Bonomi. "They're leaders in clubs, churches, schools, friend groups and even their families. So as we thought about this year's event, we knew it was the perfect time to invite high-schoolers to participate."

[Michigan 4-H](#) led the youth component of the event. Youth ages 14–19 were invited to attend a special pre-reception hosted by Bonomi and Dr. Erica Tobe, associate director of children and youth programming for MSU Extension. Several other members of MSU Extension's 4-H staff also supported the pre-reception, and MSU Athletics Chief of Staff Alan Haller and [MSU College of Agriculture and Natural Resources](#) (CANR) Dean Ron Hendrick delivered keynote addresses.

"Having the ability to listen to adults with higher experiences than what I have had so far in my life, and being able to identify and relate with the things they have gone through on their own leadership journeys was an opportunity like no other," said Savannah Mauk, an Eaton County 4-H'er.

Michigan 4-H to participate in Giving Tuesday

2019-2020 Enrollment Fees/4-H Online

Our new 4-H year began on September 1, 2019. All 4-H members and leaders are strongly encouraged to enroll online. If you have forgotten your 4-H online login information, please do not make a new profile. Instead, please contact our office and we can reset your password for you. To register for 2019-2020 go to www.mi.4honline.com

The deadline to enroll in 4-H Online and to **pay your enrollment fee** of \$20 per member (\$60 family, 4+ children) will be **March 31, 2020 by 5:00 p.m.** There will be no exceptions to this deadline. If your child is not registered and paid for, they will not be eligible to participate in 4-H for the current year (including fair, as a 4-H member). Please keep in mind that this deadline does not override your club's deadline. Example: your Key Leader requires you to pay your enrollment fee and register online by January 1, 2020. You would follow that deadline. We encourage all payments be made with your Key Leader but you may make a payment in the MSU Extension office. For your convenience, we now can take credit/debit cards over the phone or you can mail your payment in.

State 4-H Awards Program

The State 4-H Awards program, the highest honor bestowed on Michigan 4-H youth, is for 4-H youth aged 13 and up who have at least three years of 4-H experience. Youth compete in 19 different award areas showcasing their knowledge, skills, and experiences. To apply, youth submit the application to MSUE.4Hawards@campusad.msu.edu and harmanha@msu.edu by **February 1**. Applications are carefully reviewed by selection committees. Delegates are invited to participate in either an advanced leadership development program (juniors) or competitive interviews (seniors) during 4-H Exploration Days. State 4-H Award winners are announced at the 4-H Recognition Program, during 4-H Exploration Days. 4-H Mark of Excellence Award

4-H youth who are 11 or 12 years old are eligible to apply for the 4-H Mark of Excellence Award. To enter, a young person needs to write an essay on the theme, "Because of 4-H I can...". Counties select their representatives, and submit names and essays to the State 4-H Awards Committee. The deadline for submission is **February 1, 2020 in the MSU Extension office, 5:00 p.m.**

New Leader Requirement for Fair Pass

New this year... All Cass County 4-H Leaders must participate in one of the following activities before June 17 in order to receive their \$5 fair leader pass:

- Attend 1 Leaders' Association or Horse Leaders' Meeting
- Volunteer at 1 county event (Leaders' Association Auction, Horse Leaders' Horse Show, County Programs hosted throughout the year, Trunk-or-Treat, etc.)
- Host a county or club educational activity/event
- Attend 1 or 3 provided professional development opportunities (dates to be announce in the next Clover)

Sign-in sheets will be present at all county events. Do not forget to sign in to get your credit! Club events will be at the discretion of the Key Leader and they will track the participation.

Mandatory Beef Weigh-In

All beef market cattle must be in possession of the exhibitor no later than beef weigh-in, for the 2020 Cass County Fair. All beef market cattle must be brought to the Cass County Fairgrounds with a completed beef market cattle validation form and have an official ear tag ID inserted. Calves should have RFID tags and all breed steers will need to have registration papers and be tattooed by weigh in. This will be held on Saturday, December 14, 2019 at the fairgrounds.
