- Cloverbud projects are non-competitive and will not be judged or placed.
- Cloverbuds participate in Cloverbud class in rabbit/cavy showmanship at fair.
- Cloverbuds and their parents/guardians are jointly responsible for the ownership and care of the rabbit/cavy.

Showmanship:

- All members are required to participate in the showmanship division of the 4-H Rabbit/Cavy Project.
- Exhibitors are to be appropriately and neatly dressed (and groomed) in a long-sleeved white shirt or lab coat and black pants.

About the 4-H Project Record Book:

Project record books are to be cumulative. Previous years' records should remain in the record book in reverse chronological order with the current year placed on top. Keeping past years' records in the record book allows the member, leader, and/or the judge to have a better context in which to assess a member's current knowledge and skill level. It also allows the member access to important records and information that he/she has gathered over the years.

Members are encouraged to insert club worksheets and activities in the record book wherever they fit logically.




