Mary does many cooking demos on Zoom from her home kitchen for libraries across the state. She teaches a variety of cooking classes at The Old World Olive Company in Plymouth. For many years, she did demos at ABC Warehouse locations in Livonia, Troy, Lakeside and Novi.

Mary has conducted food tours, done menu planning and researched heirloom recipes. She has been teaching cooking for over 25 years and has more than 5,500 cookbooks.

PAR Report - Kathryn Fitzpatrick





We are in the harvest season in earnest now with 1083.5 lbs. of vegetables donated so far. The team has been focused on harvesting onions, green onions, cabbage, green beans, a variety of hot peppers, carrots, kale, collard greens, kohlrabi, tomatillos, and squash. In addition, the carrots, kohlrabi, and green onions needed to be washed, and the greens and/or roots removed. The garlic and onions were allowed to dry so that the tops and roots could be removed. We did keep enough of the garlic to plant in the fall but will be ordering some new seed garlic to see if it fares better and produces more robust heads of garlic. The cucumber plants did not grow well or produce well, so we may be eliminating them from future planting. Turnips have been planted a little late using seed tape to help space the tiny seeds, so we hope to have a good harvest in the fall. The cabbage also didn't produce as well as expected, so we will be looking into different cultivars for next year.

Coming up this month we will be adding the potato harvest to the rest of the bounty, addressing irrigation issues that continue to create challenges, and of course continue to battle the weeds. However, the Oakland County Spartan Alumni volunteers did a tremendous job of weeding the beds one beautiful Saturday in August for which we are most grateful!

NURSERY NOTES - Peg Palmer

The Nursery is a busy place as we prepare for the Fall Plant Sale on Saturday, September 20 from 9 am until noon. This annual event provides an opportunity to sell more great perennials that can be planted now to enjoy in Spring 2026.



We will continue to accept donations of Michigan hardy perennials through Saturday, October 11. This gives us about a week to take an inventory of the plants that we will overwinter. Please bring your donations as soon as possible!

The plants we stock are Michigan-hardy, but winter in a pot presents extra challenges. Wide temperature swings during the season can be especially tough on potted perennials and some varieties require special care to make it through. To prepare for this, a physical inventory must be completed to identify which plants need this extra attention. Once that's done, overwintering plans can be finalized. Because this process takes time, please consider donating as early as possible.

Hello Area Garden Leaders,

Garden leads are encouraged to get their planned fall divisions to the Nursery by fall plant sale or at the latest by Oct. 11, 2025. A recent email was sent out with attached wanted list.

All AGLs and Teams who would like to be reimbursed for personal expenditures made on behalf of MSU Tollgate need to submit an expense reimbursement within the MSU required a 90-day limit from date of purchase. MSU will not reimburse requests made more than 90 days or more after the date of purchase. Submittal delay risks reimbursement rejection. To be reimbursed for MSU related expenses, please submit your contact information and receipts to Destiny at pears278@msu.edu. Online purchases will additionally require a copy of your credit card statement indicating that the purchase(s) were made. Destiny will fill out the reimbursement form for you.

As you work in your gardens, please assess the need for plant identification tags for your area and submit them to Marilyn (masoleil@sbcglobal.net) using the form in the AGL handbook. We plan to work on tags during the slower winter months. Accurate Latin name and common name are best and a variety name if it is known. It is our goal to have all gardens with this information to enhance educational value and enjoyment for all visitors.


