PAR Report - Kathryn Fitzpatrick

Happy 2026! Sending a special thank you to all volunteers who have provided the labor of love and



care to this special garden, and to encourage any new volunteers to check us out. This new year's resolution for the garden is to establish a collaborative plan with the CSA team to better support the farm, the community, our wonderful volunteers, and those in need.

Our review of 2025 pointed us to planning another renovation of the beds – to level and set barriers to eliminate erosion and soggy areas for some of the beds, and new improved raised beds in collaboration with the Eagle Scouts if our plan is approved. Many of the PAR Garden beds will be seeded with cover crops or covered with black plastic for the season.

The pathways will be mulched in a manner that allows for minimal weed pressure and easier maintenance. Much of this will be possible due to a most generous donation by one of our volunteers.

The PAR Garden plan and layout have been drafted, and the final layout including the CSA fields will be settled this month. The seed order for the PAR Garden crops is ready. A tentative plan for the PAR portion of the crops in the CSA fields has been drafted.

Stay tuned for a SignUpGenius schedule for the Greenhouse where we will be starting many of the crops for the joint PAR/CSA garden beds starting in the March / April timeframe.

PRAIRIE DROPSEED

Xeriscape, according to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, is a method of landscaping developed for arid and semiarid climates that utilize drought-tolerant plants, mulch, and efficient irrigation.

While Tollgate Farm is not considered an arid climate, the plants within the xeriscape garden are drought tolerant. One of those plants is the prairie dropseed (*Sporobolus heterolepis*). It is a clump-forming, perennial grass which usually grows in prairies, prairie fens and open grounds in the Lower Peninsula. In the Upper Peninsula it can be found in the alvar grasslands. Its fine-textured, hair-like green leaves form an arching mound approximately 15" tall and 18" wide. These leaves turn reddish orange in fall and fade in winter. Flowers on its panicles can grow up to 30" tall in summer. They are pink and brown and can have a unique scent. Mature seeds drop from the flower in autumn, giving the plant its common name. Prairie dropseed is attractive in all seasons.
