IMPORTANT INFORMATION

1. Nominations to apply for an award may come from your 4-H leader or you may self-nominate. A leader signature agreeing to the information in the application is required.
2. Please neatly type or use black ink. Check spelling and grammar so form can be more easily read. Please use complete sentences.
3. If you were nominated in more than three areas, you must choose which three areas to apply for. You may only submit three applications, including the areas of achievement, citizenship, and leadership. A 4-H member will not be awarded more than 2 county medals in a calendar year or receive the same award medal in the same project two consecutive times.
4. 4-H members do not have to exhibit the project at the Eaton County Fair to qualify for an award and may submit an award application for any number of years in the project. Members must be currently enrolled in the project in 4-H Online.
5. The county awards committee will select the winners and awards will be presented at the 4-H Council Participation Celebration.
6. The applications are due to the Eaton County MSU Extension office or emailed to gottjess@msu.edu by December 20th.
7. Every question must be answered. Not applicable (N/A) will not be accepted as an answer.
8. (Optional) Leader may submit a short, signed paragraph recommending the member for the award.
