




Today, tomorrow, together.



- Began services for 317 member owners bringing power to underserved areas.
- Roanoke Cooperative first energized its original 56 miles of line on May 29, 1939
- The system has expanded to over 2,000 miles of line and infrastructure
- Currently providing electrical service to 14,500 member owners
- Bertie, Halifax, Hertford, Northampton, Gates, Perquimans, and Chowan Counties


## **AFRICAN AMERICAN LAND LOSS**

# Why Are Our Forests Important?

- Forests Provide Daily Needs
  - 4,000+ products come from trees
- Provides Clean Water(natural water filter)
- Reduces runoff and flooding
- Provides Shelter, Water, Food for Wildlife
- Stores Carbon Dioxide
- Provides Recreation(hiking, bird watching, ziplining
- Provides Mental Relaxation and Spiritual Connections
- Forestry Contributes ~\$40 Billion to NC Economy (2023\_NCSU Extension Forestry)

- Reforestation(reseeding)
- Natural Regeneration(Pine or Hardwood)
- Site Preparation
  - Herbicide Application
  - Mechanical Practices
- Timber Stand Improvement Practices
  - Pre-commercial Thinning
  - Prescribed Fire
- Water Quality Guidelines
- Insect and Disease Control
- Wildlife Habitat Improvement Practices
- Afforestation(planting trees in agriculture fields)
- Silvopasture Practices(Trees in Pasture with livestock)
