PURPOSE:

To provide a leadership and community service opportunity for fair exhibitors through the process of assisting adult superintendents in managing county fair activities.

YOUTH BENEFITS:

1. Leadership skills
2. Community service
3. Team building
4. Networking
5. Communication Skills
6. Recognition
 - a. Builds record for further recognition, including scholarship and college applications, 4-H State Awards competitions, job applications, etc.

ADULT BENEFITS:

1. Youth superintendents to assume important responsibilities.
2. Visibility of youth in leadership roles at fair
3. Role model of youth and adult teamwork/partnership
4. Help train future superintendents

TRAINING AND SUPPORT:

1. Leadership training and orientation
2. Support from the Hillsdale County Small Animal Committee
3. Support from the Hillsdale County 4-H Program

The Youth Superintendents will be responsible for the duties assigned for their selected areas.

DUTIES:

1. Assist adult superintendent in respective fair activities as determined prior to start of the Hillsdale County Fair. These duties may include, but are not limited to,
 - Setting up and taking down the project area for fair
 - Checking in exhibitors
 - Running errands on HCF grounds
 - Barn supervision, including opening and/or closing barn(s)
 - Clerking, show/auction line up and/or announcing
 - Auction preparation and data entry
 - Distributing ribbons
 - Educational opportunities
 - Helping with fundraising activities, as appropriate
 - Staff 4-H promotion activities including, but not limited to, radio interviews during fair
2. Attend meetings as scheduled and required by adult superintendent
3. Be available during the week of fair, as much as school and show schedules allow

ELIGIBILITY:

Hillsdale County Fair youth exhibitors between ages 11 & over (as of January 1st of calendar year)

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Dependable
2. Be able to communicate with others
3. Teamwork
4. Coachable and willing to follow directions

REQUIREMENTS:

1. Completed application submitted by due date
2. Letter of recommendation for leader, teacher, or coach
3. Be available during the week of fair
4. Attend orientation (1 session – August/September)
5. At least two (2) years of active enrolled 4-H status with two (2) years active showing experience in any species
6. Must attend at least 4 Small Animal Committee meetings per year.

SELECTION PROCESS:

Applications will be reviewed by the Small Animal Committee. If necessary, a phone or face-to-face interview may be conducted.

TENURE:

Two year term that is renewable in March.
