AWARDS

4-H Young Person's Achievement Award: Any 4-H member 8-11 years of age is eligible. Describe your involvement and achievements in your club and community through 4-H in your application. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H Career. Honorable Mentions will be considered. **Fill out pages 6,7 and 12.**

Junior County Award Medals: Any 4-H member 8-11 years of age is eligible. A 4-H member will not be awarded more than two medals in a calendar year. Members must have at least one year's experience in the project area. List specific projects (Example, Beef, Rabbits, Photography, and Foods & Nutrition). **Fill out pages 5 and 12.**

Intermediate County Award Medals: Any 4-H member 12-14 years of age is eligible. A 4-H member will not be awarded more than two medals in a calendar year. Members must have at least two years' experience in the project area. List specific projects (Example, Equine, Swine, Achievement, and Shooting Sports). **Fill out pages 5 and 12.**

Senior County Award Medals Any 4-H member 15 years and older is eligible. A 4-H member will not be awarded more than two medals in a calendar year. Members must have at least two years' experience in the project area. List specific projects (Example: Leadership, Public Speaking, Achievement and Baking). **Fill out pages 5 and 12.**

Key Club Award Any 4-H member 12-14 years of age and older may apply. Members must have completed three years of club work, taken at least two 4-H projects to exhibit, and served as a teen leader. Describe your involvement and achievements in your club and community through 4-H in your application. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. Honorable Mention will be considered. **Fill out pages 6, 7 and 12.**

Frank Proctor Memorial Award: Any 4-H member who is a Junior or Senior in high school or a college freshman that is an active teen leader and/or club officer may apply. Members must have at least three consecutive years in any one project or combination of project areas. Describe your involvement and achievements in your club and community through 4-H in your application. This award is given to an overall outstanding 4-H youth. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. **Fill out pages 6,7 and 12.**

Frank Proctor was a former Hillsdale businessperson who supported building youth leadership skills and community involvement.

Susan Trausch Memorial Award for Rabbits: Any 4-H member that is 15 years and older is eligible. Members must have at least three (3) consecutive years in the rabbit project. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. Sponsored by the Country Get-A-Longs 4-H Club. Application for this award **must be handwritten**. **Fill out pages 5, 10 and 11.**

Susan Trausch Memorial Award for Crafts: Any 4-H member 8-11 years of age is eligible. Members must have participated as a 5-7-year-old in a craft project to be eligible for this award. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. Sponsored by the Country Get-A-Longs 4-H Club. Application for this award **must be handwritten**. **Fill out pages 5, 8 and 9.**

"I Dare You" Leadership Award: Any 4-H member who is a Junior or Senior in high school is eligible for this award. The award is presented as recognition of excellence in character and well-balanced personal development qualities of constructive leadership. Members must have attended at least two district and/or state 4-H events and may only receive this award once during their 4-H career.

Sponsored by the 4-H Council and the American Youth Foundation.

Members cannot apply for this award; a 4-H leader must nominate them.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Michigan Capitol Experience (March): This award is for youth 4-H age 13 (as of January 1st) and up. Members may only receive this award once during their 4-H career. 4-H Capitol Experience is an annual three-day conference that helps prepare youth for active citizenship by focusing on civic engagement and public policy. You will experience state government in action and learn how you can influence policy issues. Participants interact with legislators, state agency staff, lobbyists, and other resources people to learn how policy is made. Simulations and activities are incorporated to reinforce and apply what is learned about government.

***The total cost of Capitol Experience is approximately \$385.00. Your share of the cost will be \$100.00 plus some out-of-pocket meals. The 4-H Council will cover the remaining cost (approximately \$285.00). Transportation to the event is the responsibility of the family. Participants' share must be paid prior to attending the event to the Hillsdale County 4-H Council. ***You will be notified if you win this award before the award ceremony. **Fill out pages 6,7 and 12.**

4-H Council Scholarship: Two scholarships at \$500.00 each will be awarded. Applicant must be currently enrolled in 4-H and have been a member for a minimum of 2 years. They must also be a graduating high school senior or currently attending a 2- or 4-year accredited college, university, business, vocational or trade school. Financial need will not be considered. Applicant shall demonstrate positive leadership by involvement in activities such as school, extra-curricular, community, work, or church activities. Applicant shall exhibit good citizenship in school and in the community. This scholarship is non-renewable. A letter of recommendation is required, it may be from a staff or administrative member of the applicant's high school, a 4-H or FFA leader, or someone related to the applicant's civic or work-related activities. **Submit a 1-page essay on the following topic: Personally define the 4-H pledge and how it applies to your 4-H experience. An interview will also be required; applicants will be contacted to set up dates and times.**
