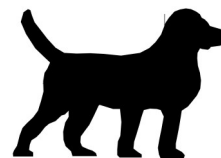
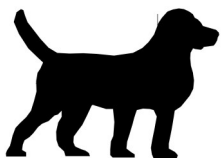

PROJECT ANIMAL CERTIFICATE/CARE FORM

PROJECT ANIMAL CERTIFICATION: We, the youth department exhibitor and parent/guardian, certify that we have read, acknowledge, accept and will abide by all the rules as set forth in the Hillsdale County Fair Youth Department section of the Fair premium paper as they pertain to exhibition of this specie. We further certify that we have not administered to the above-identified animal (s). Nor has it received, any substance not approved by the federal Food & Drug Administration (FDA), the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and/or the Fair for slaughter/breeding stock animals. This includes, but is not limited to, diuretics, steroids, and tranquilizers. We also certify that, with respect to any drug, chemical or feed additive approved by the FDA and/or USDA for slaughter animals, that the applicable withdrawal period as recognized by the FDA has expired prior to weigh-in/entry at the fair (whichever occurs first).

We acknowledge and accept the fact that all animals entered in the Hillsdale County Fair Youth Department classes are subject to blood, urine and tissue tests, and that Youth Department Fair officials reserve the right to disqualify any animal, either live or slaughtered, found in violation of the use of drugs, chemicals, or feed additives as described above in the Hillsdale County Fair Youth Department section of the fair premium paper. Disqualification will result in the forfeiture of all trophies, special awards, livestock premium monies and other consideration earned, and the assessment of a fine against any and all premiums earned in association with the animal(s) disqualified. In addition, the exhibitor will be subject to any and all the penalties as detailed in the penalties for misconduct. If the animal is disqualified because of a positive test and/or the carcass is condemned at slaughter, the class placings will not be charged.

We will allow the designed veterinarian to draw any and all samples deemed appropriated from our animal (s).

We will indemnify and hold harmless the Fair and all of its sponsors and assisting organizations their employees and agents, against all legal or other proceedings in connection with said drug testing. We will indemnify and hold harmless the Fair and its sponsors and assisting organizations against all claims or injury to the animal and any damage or injury to any person or property caused by the animal.

PROJECT ANIMAL CARE: We have read, acknowledge, accept and will abide by all the animal care/housing maintenance rules as set forth in the Hillsdale County Youth Department section of the Fair premium paper and these listed below:

Keeping the exhibit space assignments clean is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Pens or cages will be checked by project superintendents on a daily basis for cleanliness. Chores must be completed twice daily, by 10:00 am and 8:00 pm. If a pen or cage is not clean, it will be tagged by the project superintendent. If a pen or cage is tagged, the exhibitor MUST check in with the project superintendent at times at times stated on the pen tag. First and second offense will result in a written warning tag, as well as a meeting with member, project superintendent and a parent or responsible adult. A third offence in the same specie will result in a ONE YEAR suspension from exhibition of that specie at eh Hillsdale County Fair.

CODE OF CONDUCT: We agree to conduct ourselves with honesty, integrity and good sportsmanship. We will treat all fair and livestock show management personnel, fair officials, judges, and exhibitors with courtesy, cooperation and respect and shall not direct any abusive or threatening conduct towards them. Furthermore, we will not direct criticism or interference with fair and livestock show management personnel, fair officials, judges and exhibitors in conducting the activities associated with the event. We understand that any conduct that is contrary to these items will be brought before the Youth Division Fair Advisory Committee for review and may result in the disqualification of individual people and animal (s) from the activities associated with the Hillsdale County Fair Youth Department.

Dress Code for State 4-H dog Show



- ◆ Any clothing which draws undue attention to one's self, or clothing that may distract other handlers, spectators, or the judge(s), is unacceptable.
- ◆ Halter tops, low-cut blouses or sweaters, shorts, hats, mini-skirts, denim of any type, style or color, and bare mid-drifts are **NOT ACCEPTABLE IN ANY CLASS**
- ◆ Skirts/culottes shorter than fingertip length are not recommended.
- ◆ Flat shoes such as tennis shoes, should be worn by all exhibitors. Sandals, high heels, or boots are not recommended.
- ◆ Long hair should be tied back. Jewelry that makes noise or interferes with handling should be avoided. No clothing with club name, personal identification, or Logos or other printed words or saying will be allowed.
- ◆ For Junior Showmanship, females should consider wearing skirts, culottes, dresses or jumpers (with appropriate tops) no shorter than fingertip length (Dress slacks are acceptable).
- ◆ For Junior Showmanship, males should consider wearing dress slacks and a shirt and tie or turtleneck (Jackets or suits are optional).
- ◆ For Obedience, dress slacks are acceptable.
- ◆ For Agility, athletic attire including shorts that are at least fingertip length, polo shirts or t-shirts free from club name, personal identification, or logos or other printed words or sayings are acceptable. Clothing should be neat and free from wrinkles.
- ◆ If at any time the judge feels your attire is not appropriate, it may reflect on your placing.
