- Market Rabbit possession date: 9/1.
- A Single Fryer class was added
- Dogs will now be required to have the following vaccines: Rabies, CDV, CPV, Bordetella, CIV, CAV-2

Equine:

- Classes will now be broken up as follows: Cloverbuds, 8-10, 11-13, 14 & Over.

Large Animal:

Feeder Calf: MANDATORY VACCINE schedule:

July 13th, August 10th, and Fair Check-In. If you miss a mandatory vaccine date you will not be eligible to show at the fair.

Beef: Registration papers are required for all registered breeding stock, if papers can not be produced your animal will show as Crossbred.

Bred and Owned Class was added.

Sheep: Bred and Owned is now open to anyone enrolled in Hillsdale County 4-H.

The Michigan 4-H and FFA State Livestock Judging Contest is returning this year at a new date! Participants can demonstrate their livestock evaluation and selection skills, as well as improve their communication and decision-making skills at this fun statewide contest. The day will include both individual and team competition with classes of beef cattle, Boer goats, sheep and swine.

Contest divisions include:

- 4-H Juniors Ages 8-13 as of January 1
- 4-H Seniors Ages 14-19 as of January 1
- FFA Junior High Youth that recently completed seventh or eighth grade
- FFA High School Youth that recently completed grades 9-12
- MLE Ages 8-21 as of January 1 and not a member of 4-H or FFA
- Cloverbuds Age 7 as of January 1, non-competitive
