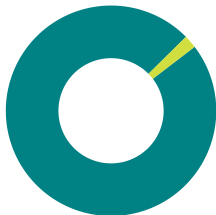
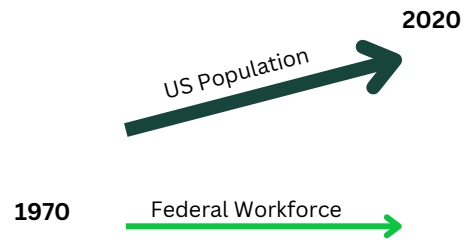


# FEDERAL & FDA WORKFORCE

## Size of Federal Workforce has Not Increased Over Time

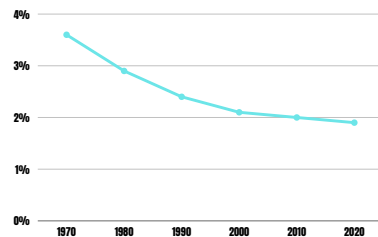
The U.S. population has grown by 65% in the last 50 years while the number of federal employees has stayed about the same since 1970.



2% federal workforce  
98% civilian workforce

Federal employees represent 2% of the overall U.S. workforce.

As a percentage of the overall workforce, federal employment has been cut in half since 1970.



FDA's Human Foods Program (HFP) represents 0.03% of the federal workforce.

## Size of FDA-HFP Workforce into Perspective

The FDA's Human Food Program has about 800 employees. This means 16 employees per state if they were spread out evenly through the U.S. states.

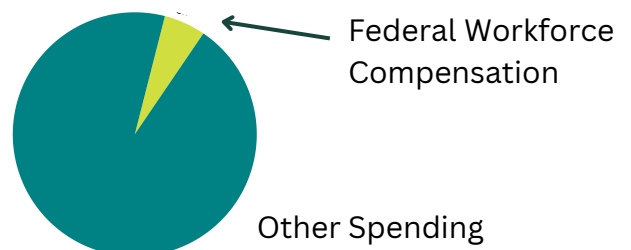

## What does the FDA-HFP Cost the American Tax Payer?

The total budget of the Human Food Program equals \$4.02 per person in the U.S.

Payroll represents 6% of the federal budget.
