Small Animal Showmanship Clinics:

June 17 (Tuesday) – with Small Animal Assoc meeting to immediately follow June 23 (Monday)

July 2 (Wednesday)

July 10 (Thursday)

July 13 (Sunday) - with Small Animal Assoc meeting to immediately follow

All will be held at the Small Animal barn at the Fairgrounds from 6:30 PM - 7:30 PM

**Clinics will be cancelled if temperatures reach 85 degrees or higher, it is a good idea to plan to attend the earliest available date.

- **Poultry Members** To continue keeping the fair birds safe of Avian Influenza, NO live birds will brought to the clinics. We will utilize fake birds to teach showmanship. If you have any questions, please contact one of the poultry superintendents.
- If you plan to sell your rabbit, chicken or goat at the fair, you <u>NEED</u> to register for the Small Animal Auction. There will be a message box that pops up AFTER submitting sign-up for small animals. Click on the link in the box to sign-up for your small animal auction project.
- If members/leaders have any questions, please reach out to the species-specific superintendent. Educational information and other details/reminders will be available to clinic attendees. We <u>highly</u> encourage members to attend at least one of the clinics so there are no surprises at fair check-in. Because clinics will be cancelled if temperatures reach 85 degrees or higher, it is a good idea to plan to attend the earliest available date. That also gives time for solving any issues that may be noted when animals are seen at the clinics.
- We are looking for rabbit members who have placed in the top three of their showmanship classes to help at the showmanship clinics. There are many younger and new 4-H members that could use your help. If you would be willing to be on the mentoring team, please call the Extension Office to volunteer. You may be surprised how helping others learn will also improve your knowledge base.

FAIR BOARD NEWS

Amusement Ride Passes are now on sale at the Fair Office. The advance price is \$20 per pass. Regular wrist band prices are \$25 per day Monday – Friday and \$30 Saturday. Advance passes will be available until July 18 or when 500 are sold, call the Fair Office at (989) 773-9070 to place your order. Office hours will be Tuesday – Thursday from 10 AM – 1 PM. It's always a good idea to call in advance before coming to the office.

We still have ISABELLA COUNTY FAIR T-SHIRTS available for \$10 in the office.

Starting July 1st camping permits will be available for you to pick up in the fair office. If you paid for a parking pass or cart permit, they will be in your envelope. There are no open camping sites available.

Still Exhibit, Horses, Dairy, and Small Animal sign-up is open and will <u>close on June 13 at 10:00 p.m.</u> ***There will be NO EXCEPTIONS for late entries***

There are a few things to take note of:

- There will be a message box that pops up AFTER submitting sign up for small animals. Click on the link in the box to sign up for your small animal auction project.
- There is a separate form for the Cloverbud craft section. Cloverbuds are not allowed to sell in the Still Exhibit Auction.
- You will get a "receipt" from Google following your registration to the email that you used to sign up. If you do NOT receive an email within 24 hours of your sign up, contact Kapre at <u>kaprefilhart@gmail.com</u> to make sure that your sign up went through. ALL sign ups are due June 13 at 10 PM. There will be no exceptions.
- You will need to know which project you plan to sell for the Still Exhibit Auction upon signing up (crafts sign up AND auction form due on June 13!). There is a second section under each still exhibit department that will allow you to indicate whether or not you wish to sell a project from that section. You are still only allowed to sell ONE item for still exhibit auction. You will need to know which exhibit you are selling at the time of sign up. Cloverbuds are not allowed to sell still exhibits.

**Large Animal/Livestock Exhibitors (dairy feeders, beef, swine, and sheep) do not have a sign up because your sign-up is your tag-in/weigh-in. HOWEVER, you DO need to fill out the drug use form that can be found on the website using the drop down menu under the Large Animals tab.

4-H Award Information

Outstanding 4-H Member & Chet Brown Applications Available

Applications are now being accepted for this year's Outstanding 4-H Member and the Chester Brown Memorial Leadership Development Award. Applications are available on the MSU Extension website at: <u>https://www.canr.msu.edu/isabella/isabella_county_4_h/newsletters-and-forms</u> or at the Extension office. Completed applications are due at the Extension office by July 15. Eligibility requirements are as follows:

Outstanding 4-H Member

(winner will be selected to receive \$500 towards CWF Trip, National Club Congress Trip, or scholarship towards higher education)

- 1. Applicants must be 15 years of age (by January 1, 2025).
- 2. Completed three calendar years of 4-H club work.
- 3. Completed 4-H projects in at least two project areas.
- 4. Been recommended by local leader.
- 5. Applicants will be interviewed on Friday of fair week.

Chester Brown Memorial Leadership Development Award

- 1. Applicants must be 13 years of age (by January 1, 2025).
- 2. Applicants should demonstrate leadership abilities in an activity. This activity should not be eligible for fair exhibition. Examples of eligible activities: community service project, school related activity, church activity.
- 3. Selection will be based upon organizational skills, number of people participating, and how they were involved.
- 4. Applicants will be interviewed on Friday of fair week.

Other 4-H Award Opportunities - you must sign up for these on your fair entry form:

4-H Jr. Teen Leadership Award - Ages 10-12

- 1. Enroll in the 4-H junior leadership project with club leader and 4-H office.
- 2. Complete the self-reflection form with your 4-H leader.
- 3. Complete two or more junior leader activities (see application for suggestions)
- 4. Display a poster (28" x 22") at the fair depicting some aspect of your project.
- 5. Be interviewed by a fair judge.

4-H Teen Leadership Award - Ages 13-19

For all 4-H members who have enrolled in a teen leadership project and completed it prior to the beginning of fair week. Must complete a poster (28"x22") and evaluation form available from the Extension office. Two \$50 cash awards are given.

Junior Achievement Booth Award - Ages 12-14

Showcase your participation in 4-H with an Achievement Booth at the fair. Guidelines and suggestions are available from the Extension office. One winner will be selected and will receive a choice of: \$125 towards a trip to Washington, DC (WOW - Wonders of Washington).

Senior Achievement Booth Award - Ages 15-19

Here is your opportunity to highlight your 4-H participation. Guidelines are available from the Extension office. One winner will receive a choice of: \$300 toward a trip to CWF (Citizen Washington Focus) in Washington, D.C. next summer; National Club Congress held next November in Atlanta, Georgia; or scholarship towards higher education.

Animal Care - All animals should be fed and watered each day by 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM. Your responsibility for your animal does not end after the animal is sold. Clean pens/stalls give a favorable impression to the public.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Still Exhibits will be entered on Saturday, July 19 from 9 AM 12 PM
- Still Exhibits will be released on Sunday, July 27 from 8 AM 10 AM.
 ***<u>REMINDER</u> ALL Still Exhibits <u>must</u> be picked up on Sunday, July 27. If you cannot pick up your project, <u>PLEASE</u> make arrangements with someone to pick it up for you. Any Still Exhibits left in the barn will be discarded.
- Large Animal Project Records must be turned in at the 4-H Still Exhibit Building on Monday, July 21 between 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM. The superintendent will be present to accept project records and check off member's names from the species list, so we know you have turned in your records. Records that are to be judged will be separated from the others and judged on Monday afternoon.

Small Animal Members

Just a few reminders:

- If you plan to sell your animal project in the Small Animal Auction, you must complete the online registration by June 13. (You may sell only one species in the Small Animal Auction - one goat, rabbit, or pen of poultry).
- Feed Records <u>are required</u> You have a choice of either the short Simple Form or the longer Record Sheet for each individual species which can be entered to be judged. To be considered for best feed record, you must sign up for Small Animal Project Records, under Dept. 17, Educational Science.

Registration is now open for the Michigan 4-H and FFA State Livestock Judging Contest! Participants can demonstrate their livestock evaluation and selection skills, as well as improve their communication and decision-making skills at this fun statewide contest. The day will include both individual and team competition with classes of beef cattle, Boer goats, sheep and swine.

Contest divisions include:

- 4-H Juniors 4-H youth ages 8-13 as of January 1
- 4-H Seniors 4-H youth ages 14-19 as of January 1
- FFA Junior High FFA members that recently completed seventh or eighth grade
- FFA High School FFA members that recently completed grades 9-12
- MLE Youth ages 8-21 as of January 1 that are competing in the Michigan Livestock Expo but are not a member of 4-H or FFA
- Cloverbuds 4-H youth age 7 as of January 1, non-competitive
