Flag Pledges

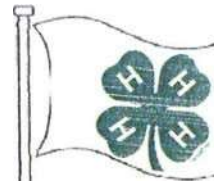


The American Flag Pledge:

(Arms at sides)



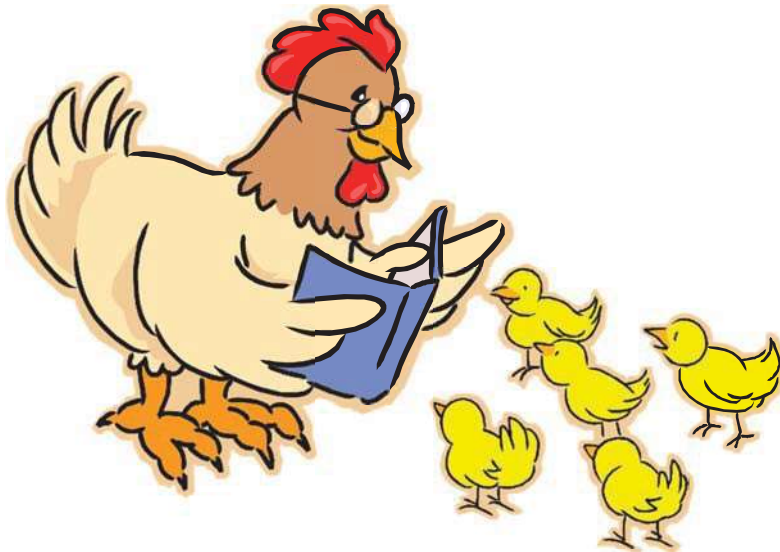

Objectives of the 4-H Cloverbud Poultry Project

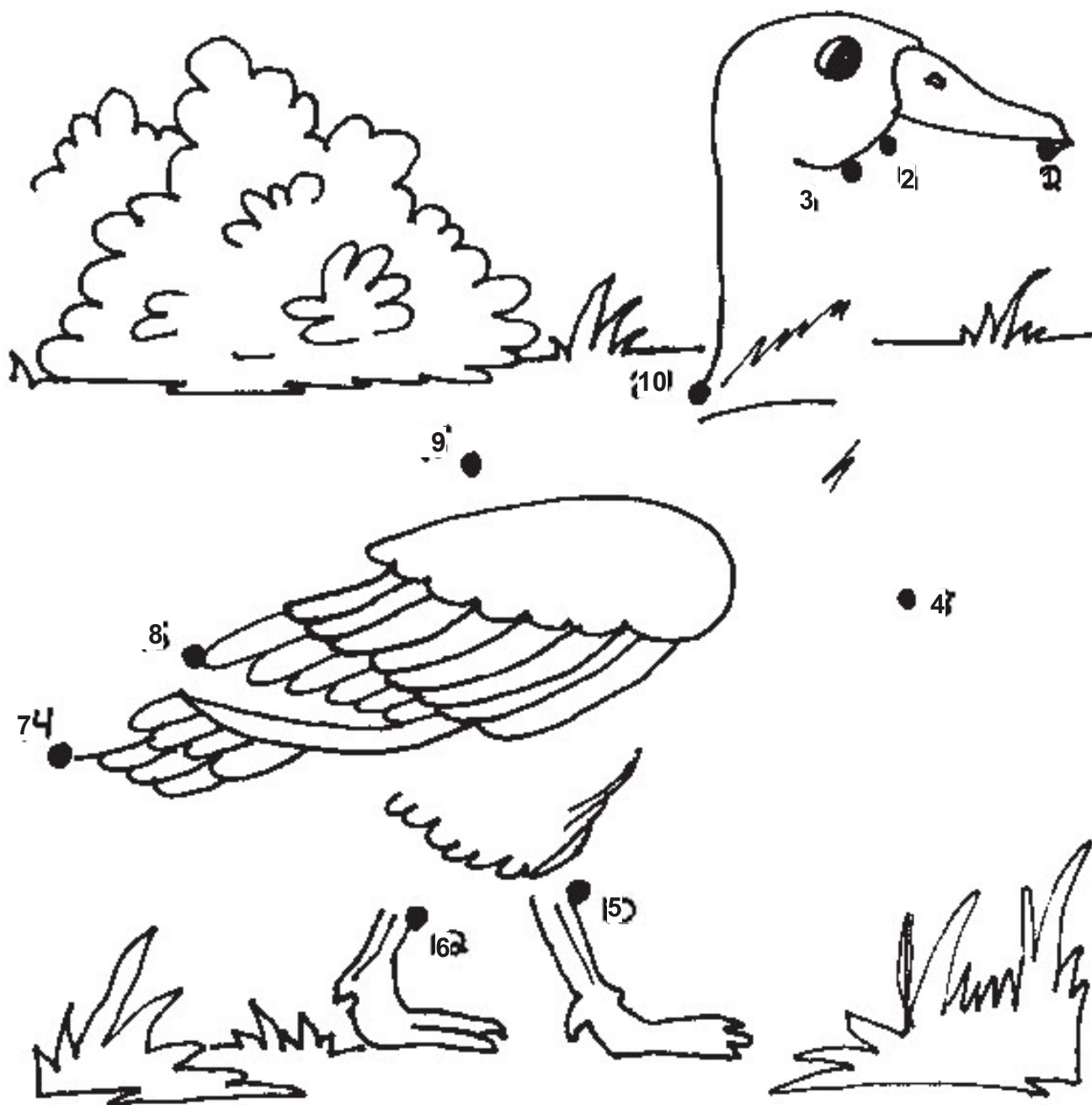
1. To gain experience caring for poultry.

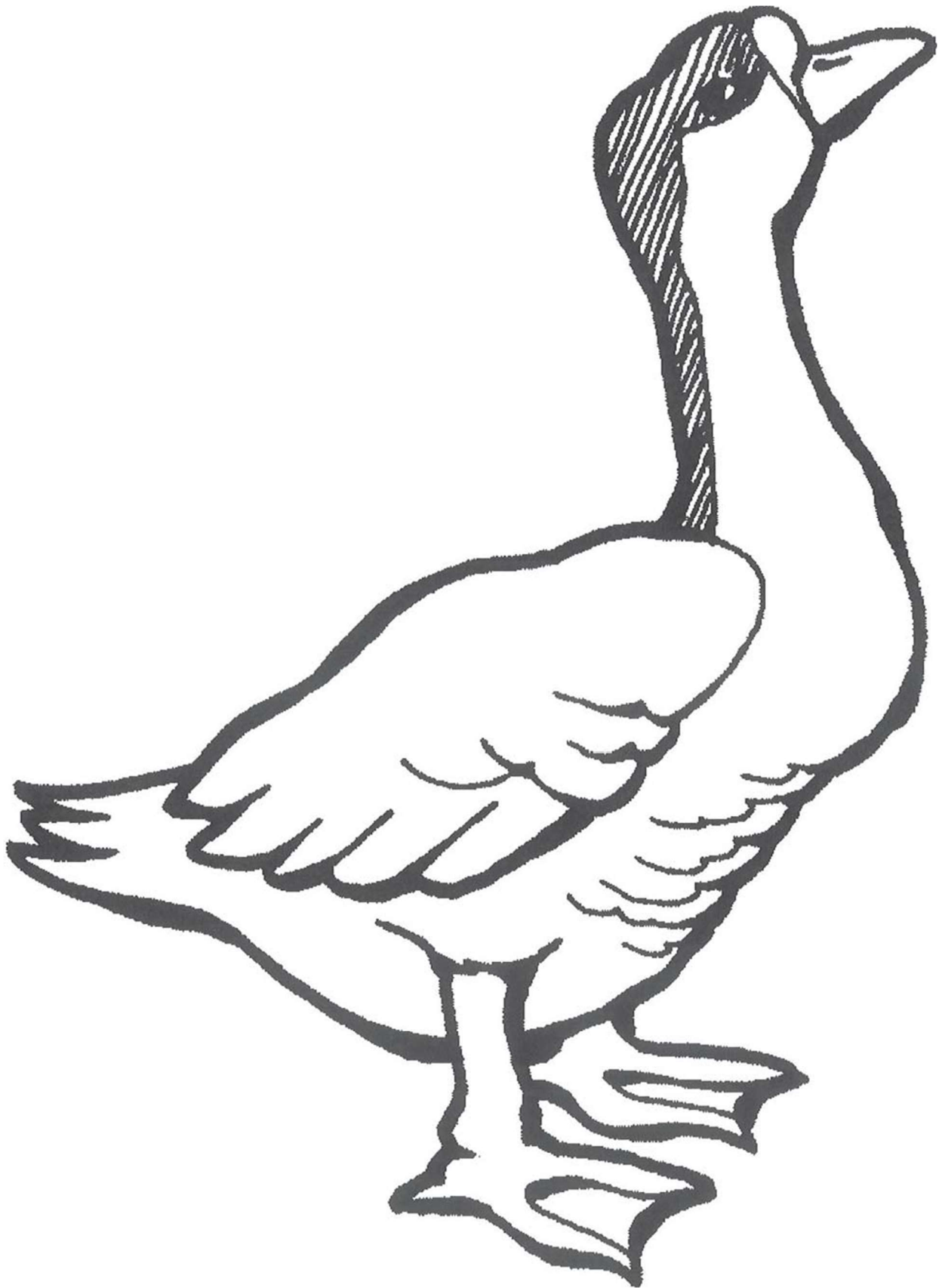

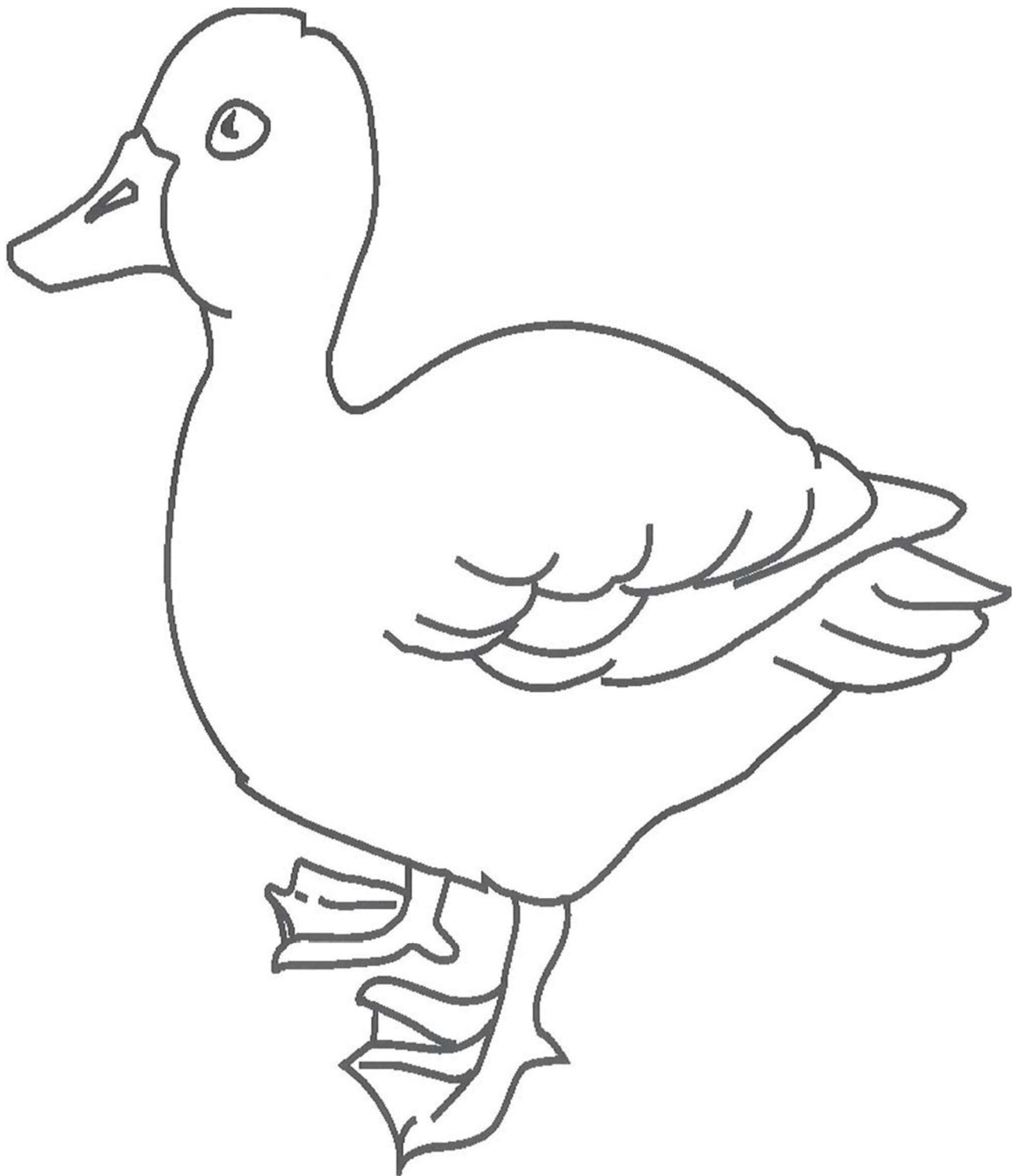
