Please make sure that you keep an eye on your kids. There are a lot of trucks and trailers and we don't want anyone to get hurt. If you are driving to drop animals off please make sure that you are keeping an eye out for children. They are excited and may not stop at the edge of the road to look for you!

Large animal drop off - please come in the gate near the food booth (off from Lamont St.), take a right onto the road and then a left and go down the road between the horse barns and the bathrooms. Once unloaded please move your vehicles to keep the flow of traffic moving.

Small animal drop off - please pull near your barns, drop transport cages and move your vehicles to a parking spot. This will keep parking open for other families to drop off their animals.

Horses - will come in the second gate across from the sheriffs department, similar to when you come in for open show and practice.

Remember that your animals may not enter a barn before they have been health checked either by your species superintendent or the fair vet (depending on the species)

Campers may check in between 9am and 6pm on August 5.

Poultry Project News

It's almost fair time! Now is the time to gather everything that you will be bringing to make sure that you have what you need.

Things to prepare and bring to fair:

- Market journals and educational exhibits (brought Saturday, August 3)
- Signed and completed Animal Care Form
- Your birds! You will sign up at the mandatory meeting on August 1 for a time to bring your birds to the barn.
- \$1 per bird that you are bringing into the barn. You must bring exact change.
- Show clothes: hole free pants with a collared shirt. Often poultry is shown wearing black pants and a white collared shirt, though not required. A lab coat is also optional. You will also need closed-toe shoes or boots.
- Recyclable plastic containers for both food and water for every cage of birds you are bringing; DO
 NOT bring reusable feeders and waterers, they will not be allowed.
- Bedding for all of your cages
- Any supplies to clean your bird(s)
- A cane if you are showing a turkey, if you desire to use one.

For market birds, you must also bring two 4x6 copies of a picture of you with your bird. You should be dressed nicely (think show attire), your bird should be clean, and the picture should be up close. The back of every copy MUST be labeled with your name and what type of bird it is (roaster, broiler, cornish, hen turkey, tom turkey, pekin, etc.). You will need a set of pictures for each type of market bird, or pen, you are bringing. Please note - if your entry is a pen of three, you don't need all three birds in the picture.

Goat Project Updates

Are you ready for fair?

Please review your goat project guidelines here: <u>Goat project guidelines</u> Some highlights:

- You must attend at least 2 meetings to show at the fair in August.
 - The all-species meeting DOES count as one of those meetings if you attended.
 - YQCA does NOT count as a project meeting
 - The mandatory livestock meeting before fair does NOT count as a project meeting
- ALL goats coming to the fairgrounds, whether being shown or not, must been identified and have had the required pictures turned in with the registration form by 6/1/24.
- Goats that were not identified by the deadline are not eligible for exhibiting at fair and will not be allowed to be unloaded at the fairgrounds.

Remember:

Animals may not be shown in more than one 4-H sanctioned fair in a calendar year. But! MLE or other showcases not affiliated with MSU Extension 4-H are acceptable.

4-H Mall and Barn Clean-up

Each Kalamazoo County 4-H youth member that participates in the 4-H mall and barn clean-up day on Saturday, July 27 will receive a coupon good for 1 elephant ear (or up to \$10.00 towards another food item) at the Fair's food vendors. Coupons can only be redeemed on Saturday, August 10 and cannot be used at the 4-H Food Booth.

In order to receive the coupon, each 4-H youth member must sign and out the attendance sheet provided by 4-H on clean-up day with both arrival and departure times and be there for a minimum of 2 hours. Sign up sheet will be with Veronica under the overhang at the livestock arena.

Youth will also be able to pick up the tags to attach to their still projects.

It is considered the minimum- be creative! There must be an educational element (show something going on in the beef industry, talk about feed products, illness/ treatment that your beef steer could experience, etc.) A profit and loss statement must be filled out and included in your educational exhibit for your calf to be sold in the auction.

- August 5- Calf check in/ Weigh in/ Showmanship clinic: You can check in your steers/calves into the Beef/Feeder
 Calf barn Monday, August 5- time: TBD- Kyle, Greg or Sara must look at your calf before the calf comes off of the
 trailer. Feeder calf weigh in will take place after the beef are weighed in.
- We will have a showmanship clinic—time TBD
- August 7- Show day Feeder Calf show will be held at 2 pm; Beef show will be held at 4 pm
- August 8 Pizza party 6 pm; Set up for Auction 6:45pm
- August 9- Auction 10 am

For your calf to be eligible to go through the auction:

- ✓ You must have submitted a picture via Facebook/email/ mail to Kyle, Sara or Greg by earlier in the year
 (per project requirements),
- ✓ A picture of a clean calf/clean 4H member must be given to either Kyle, Sara or Greg on Tuesday of fair (to be given to your buyer), and
- ✓ You must have a profit and loss statement filled out per Project Record Book Requirements.
- ✓ Dairy Feeder Calves must have weigh at least 366.5 lbs on Monday August 5 to go through auction.
- August 10- @ Noon THANK YOU NOTES DUE



Michigan 4-H Youth Code of Conduct

The opportunity to participate in or attend 4-H activities is a privilege. All 4-H participants – youth, families, volunteers, and Extension staff who participate in or attend any activity or event sponsored by the Michigan State University Extension 4-H Youth Development Program are expected to uphold the values of the Michigan 4-H program.



All 4-H youth participants must conduct themselves according to the following standards that apply to all Michigan 4-H programs, including virtual programs, and interactions such as social media and internet engagement:

- 1. Create a Welcoming Environment for All. Encourage everyone to fully participate in 4-H. Recognize that all people have skills and talents that can help others and improve the community. Though we will not always agree, we must disagree respectfully. When we disagree, try to understand why. Our first priority is to create a safe, inclusive space for learning, sharing and collaboration that is welcoming to people from diverse backgrounds, cultures, and perspectives. Diversity includes, but is not limited to race, color, national origin, gender, gender identity, religion, age, height, weight, disability, political beliefs, sexual orientation, marital status, family status or veteran status.
- 2. **Bring Your Best Self.** Conduct yourself in a manner that reflects honesty, integrity, self-control, and self-direction. Accept the results and outcomes of 4-H activities and programs with grace and empathy for other participants. Accept the final opinions of judges and evaluators. Be open to new ideas, suggestions, and opinions of others.
- 3. **Obey the Law.** Obey the laws of the locality, state and nation and Michigan State University and Extension policies and guidelines. Commit no illegal acts. Do not possess, offer to others, or use alcohol, illegal drugs, marijuana, or tobacco products, which include e-pens, e-pipes, e-hookah, e-cigars, JUULs, vapes, vape pens or other electronic nicotine delivery systems. Do not attend 4-H activities under the influence of alcohol or illegal substances. Do not possess or use weapons or firearms except as expressly permitted as part of supervised 4-H shooting sports programming. This includes dangerous or unauthorized materials such as explosives or similar items.
- 4. **Honor Diversity Yours and Others'.** Respect and uphold the rights and dignity of all persons with whom you interact as part of Michigan 4-H.
- 5. **Create a Safe Environment.** Be kind and compassionate toward others. Be considerate and courteous of all persons and their property. Do not carelessly or intentionally harm or intimidate anyone in any way (verbally, mentally, physically, or emotionally). Do not insult, harass, or bully others or engage in other hostile behaviors, including sexual harassment, sexual assault or sexual abuse. Abstain from sexual behavior and intimate physical/sexual contact in either public or private situations at an MSU Extension youth 4-H activity or event.
- 6. **Be a Team Player.** Work cooperatively with all individuals involved in 4-H programs and activities. Be responsive to the reasonable requests of the person in charge such as volunteers and staff. Respect the integrity of the group and the group's decisions.
- 7. Humane Treatment of Animals. Treat animals humanely and provide appropriate animal care.
- 8. **Participate Fully.** Participate in and contribute to planned programs, be on time and follow through on assigned tasks/responsibilities in a manner that fosters the safety, well-being, and quality of the educational experience for self and others.

Submissions are reviewed by the Michigan 4-H State Awards selection committee. All applicants receive written feedback from selection committees.

In addition to a plaque, each 4-H State Award winner in the senior division received a \$300 cash award, junior winners received \$100 cash awards, and achievement award winner received \$500. These awards are made possible by generous donations to the Michigan 4-H Foundation.
