A project is eligible for the silent auction if the project received a blue or red ribbon in the project class, and the exhibitor completed the requirements of the Static Project Entrepreneurship class.

How to bid on Static Projects

New and returning buyers, please log into <http://lenaweecounty4h.fairentry.com> and create or update a buyer profile, making sure your address, email and phone number are correct.

Static Projects in the Silent Auction will be displayed in Building A on the Lenawee County Fairgrounds. The Silent Auction will be available online beginning on Sunday, July 23 at 4 pm and end on Saturday, July 29 at 2 pm. Winning buyers can pick up their non-perishable items on Sunday, July 30 in Building A from 1-3 pm.

Bid on the individual lots you want to purchase. If another buyer bids higher, you will receive an email letting you know you are no longer the high bidder and you can then log back in and up your bid if you desire.

You won the bid! Now what?

Winning bidders will receive an email from FairEntry after 2 pm on Saturday, July 29.

It is the buyer's responsibility to pick up their item from Building A during project check out on July 30 from 1-3 pm. The buyer will receive an emailed invoice after the sale and is responsible for sales tax on the item. Payment is expected within 30 days of the invoice date.

Food items, floriculture and some horticulture projects will be delivered at an agreed upon date. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to contact the buyer to arrange for the delivery of fresh food, floriculture, and horticulture projects.
