The Livingston County 4-H Horse Committee will be hosting their annual Livingston County 4-H Hartland Tack and Craft Sale on Saturday, February 14th from 10 am – 2 pm at the Hartland Educational Support Service Center Gymnasium at 9525 E Highland Rd, Howell, MI 48843. Entry is free! There will also be a silent auction fundraiser with bidding ending at 1 pm.

The Tack and Craft Sale is the biggest fundraiser for the Livingston County 4-H Horse Committee and profits from vendor spaces and the silent auction fund programs and activities.

Vendors can sign up now and reserve a space. Single spaces are \$25 and double spaces are \$40. Tables are \$10 each. Check out the registration for details on tables sizes.

Registration closes on February 6th and there is a late fee for registrations made after January 31st. 4-H Members, volunteers, and clubs get a \$5 discount.

Roots and Wings 4-H Club Report from Lucy Coppola, Club Reporter









Participate in the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute

As millions across the globe deal with food insecurity, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute (WFP MIYI) offers young people an opportunity to be part of the solution. Held May 7 in East Lansing, or by participating from anywhere else using Zoom video/web conference technology, the event seeks to inspire and prepare the next generation of global leaders to end world hunger.

To participate, youth should be in grades 7-12 and register by the March 15 deadline. As part of the registration process, youth are required to prepare a three- to five-page research paper about a developing country and one of 22 key factors that affect food security. At the event, youth present and discuss their papers with other attendees and research and industry experts.

The top performing students at the WFP MIYI will be selected to attend the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, in October. For more information, visit <https://www.canr.msu.edu/wfpmiyi/>. Registration opens February 1 and closes March 15.

Tickets now available for Michigan 4-H Day at the Breslin

MSU Extension and Michigan 4-H youth, volunteers, partners, stakeholders, alumni, staff and their families are all encouraged to attend.



Tickets can be purchased through a two-step process. First, guests should register at <https://events.anr.msu.edu/4HBreslin2026/>. Within one week, registrants will receive a custom purchase link to the email provided in registration. Attendees must then use this custom link to purchase tickets for the event. Additional ticketing information is available on the registration website. Registration will close on February 17.

Tip-off for the game is scheduled for 12 p.m. Gates to the Breslin will open at 10:30 a.m., with a variety of pre-game activities hosted by MSU Extension professionals around the concourse. Participants are encouraged to show their pride and wear green and white 4-H or MSU Extension apparel. Families for whom cost is a barrier should contact their local 4-H program coordinator.
