Local youth invited to address global hunger

The World Food Prize is the foremost international award recognizing the accomplishments of individuals who have advanced human development by improving the quality, quantity, or availability of food in the world. The World Food Prize is a \$500,000 award formally presented at the Laureate Award Ceremony in mid-October, on or around World Food Day, in conjunction with the Borlaug Dialogue international symposium.

An extension of this prestigious event for youth, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute, is held each year at the state level where students in grades 7-12 participate in a day of innovation and global impact. In Michigan, participants in can attend the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute in person in East Lansing or virtually via Zoom. The event is hosted by Michigan State University.

Participants present a research paper on a key global food issue, discuss solutions with experts, and take part in interactive sessions exploring global food security and sustainability. The top participants earn the opportunity to represent Michigan at the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, in October 2026.

Macomb County 4-H is pleased and proud to announce that L'Anse Creuse High School-North 11th grader Jackson Weingartz was selected to represent Michigan at the national World Food Prize Global Youth Institute event next week in Des Moines, lowa. Jackson will travel to the national event with four other students to participate at the national level.

Registration for the 2026 competition will be open February 1-March 15, 2026. There is no cost to participate. Learn more on the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute website.

Macomb County 4-H enrollment deadlines

Macomb County youth may enroll in 4-H at any time during the 4-H program year (Sept. 1-Aug. 31), however, **RETURNING 4-H members** who plan to show 4-H projects at the Armada Fair must be re-enrolled no later than **November 1**, **2025**. **NEW 4-H members** planning to show 4-H projects at the 2026 Armada Fair need to be enrolled in 4-H by **April 1**, **2026**. Under certain circumstances, those registering late may request that the deadline be waived. Make a Difference Day is an annual day of community service celebrated on the fourth Saturday of October, encouraging people to volunteer and help others. Established in 1992, it's one of the largest national days of volunteerism in the United States, promoting acts of kindness, community engagement, and a focus on making a positive impact through service activities.

This year, Make a Difference Day was on Saturday, October 25, 2025. For the last seven years, students from Oakland University have selected the 4-H Garden at the Max Thompson Family Resource Center in Warren as a beneficiary to receive help in cleaning and restoring the garden. Rain or shine, the students always show up and fulfill their obligation. The garden has been a hands-on learning lab for hundreds of Macomb County youth. During 4-H day camps and the A Day in the Garden program, kids learn best practices in growing their own food as well as how to harvest, eat and sometimes preserve their own food.

The Macomb County 4-H staff would like to thank the students for always lending a hand in the continued success of the garden.

Aztec, indigenous history and customs part of El Dia de los Muertos event



In honor of National Hispanic Heritage Month, youth gathered at the Max Thompson Family Resource Center in Warren on October 11 for a special Día de los Muertos (Day of the Dead) celebration! Hosted as part of the 4-H Global Education curriculum, the event gave participants a fun and creative way to learn about the history and meaning behind this colorful tradition.

Día de los Muertos has roots that go back more than 3,000 years to Indigenous peoples of Mexico, including the Aztecs, who honored their ancestors through month-long festivals. They believed that **Mictecacihuatl** ("Lady of the Dead") and **Mictlantecuhtli** ("Lord of the Dead") cared for the spirits of the departed. The familiar skeleton decorations we see today come from these ancient beliefs.

When Spanish colonizers arrived in the 16th century, the celebration was combined with All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, moving it to November 1 and 2. Today, Día de los Muertos blends indigenous and Catholic traditions to joyfully remember loved ones who have passed away.

During the 4-H event, participants made traditional crafts to decorate their ofrendas (altars), learned about corn—using popcorn as a hands-on example—and even made horchata, a traditional sweet drink. It was a lively, well-attended event full of learning, creativity and cultural appreciation.


