## Macomb County 4-H welcomes two new clubs

It's springtime and things are really growing in Macomb County 4-H. The MSU Extension staff is pleased to welcome two new clubs to our community.

The first is North Macomb 4-H Robotics Club. Club leader Becki Brice is no stranger to 4-H. She has been involved in 4-H most of her life. As a youth, she was a member in the Thumb of Michigan. She was also the club leader for School Section 4-H Club for many years. North Macomb 4-H Robotics Club is the first of its type in Macomb County, and the group's focus is of course robotics. Once a school team, they segued into being a 4-H club. The team was well known in the robotics community and has even competed at a national level.

Next is 4-H REBELS. Club Leader Aaron Duspiva was an active member of a club back in Parma, Idaho. When Aaron came to Michigan he sought out 4-H and became a gold-level volunteer. He volunteered with a few other clubs and events just to get a feel for how 4-H operated here in Macomb County, Michigan. He finally decided to form his own club, but he didn't have kids or a co-leader. Not giving up,

he became one of the co-leaders for the Thompson 4-H Garden Club in Warren. Along with Corrine Goodwin, the two have been shadowing Ms. Lizz and participating in the club for a while. Corrine's children have participated in A Day in the Garden, the Day Camps at the Thompson Center in Warren, and many county events over the last few years. The Thompson 4-H Garden Club is a Special Interest (SPIN) Club, not a chartered club. Its purpose is to get families interested and acquainted with 4-H.

The club members wanted to participate in the Armada Fair this year so, at the March meeting, they voted to move over to the chartered 4-H REBELS club.
