

Youth in Missaukee County are gaining valuable skills and confidence through the Spot On Shooting 4-H Club. The program teaches firearm safety and marksmanship in a supportive, hands-on environment. All equipment, including rifles, ammunition, and safety gear, is provided, making it easy for new participants to get involved.



Instructors work closely with youth, helping them track their progress and build confidence. Many participants are keeping their first targets to measure growth throughout the 4-H year.
