





YQCA TRAINING



Complete YQCA no later than June 09, 2025 ***PLEASE READ CAREFULLY***

YQCA Certification

Youth ages 8-19 showing <u>MARKET</u> animals (Beef, Sheep, Swine, Poultry, Rabbits) are <u>required to complete</u> <u>YQCA training no later than June 09, 2025 to be eligible to show at the Monroe County Fair.</u>

YQCA two Completion Options:

1. \$3.00 Instructor Led/ in-person training ages 8 to 18

Go to <u>YQCA - Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (yqcaprogram.org)</u>. If you created an account last year, log into your account, select a child, select the age and instructor led training. Search Michigan and select the training you wish to register for (Monroe County Instructor led YQCA training). If you are new to YQCA, you will need to first create an account in YQCA. Monroe County instructor led training to be held at the 4-H Activity Center on

YQCA Training Feb. 27th 7:00 pm @ AC YQCA Training March 27th 7:00 pm @ AC YQCA Training April 9th 7:00 pm @ AC

*** for instructor led training, Youth must register online at least two days prior to the training.

Trainings are on a first come, first serve basis until full. No walk-ins will be accepted on site. All payments must be made in advance through the YQCA website. Youth must complete the pre-test prior to attending the class and then the post- test after the training.

<u>OR</u>

2. \$12.00 **Web based training** Go to <u>YQCA - Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (yqcaprogram.org)</u> and log in using the account you created last year, if you are new to YQCA you will need to create an account. After logging in, you will need to select the correct YQCA class depending on age.

Youth can complete the course online each module takes 15-20 minutes with there is a total of five (5) modules.

*19 year olds must take online course

***Once YQCA is Completed youth <u>must provide a copy of certificate to the extension office!</u> Options to submit: electronically at https://forms.gle/wY23xBgeJ4AyrT3a8 (preferred) or hand deliver a copy to extension office. ***

 - Soap Making will now include soaps made with lye
- ~ Needlework there are six project areas, 4-Hers can enter one project in each of the six project areas
- ~ Frozen Foods now includes a Frozen Dessert project area
- ~ Cake Decorating and Other Cake Decorating is now combined into one project area
- ~ Pet Treats wil be still judged on Thursday, check-in; but project will not be kept for display. Pictures of Sweepstakes and Trophy projects will be taken and displayed on a food board, along with a listing of all 4-Hers participating and their grade
- ~ Painting now includes a project area for mixed media (which is a combination of any of the drawing project areas)
- ~ Drawing now includes a project area for mixed media (which is a combination of any of the painting project areas)

Other clarifications in the sections were added. Please read all general rules and section project rules before starting your project.

New Project Sections

Section 893- Coloring Pages

- a. This project may be a color by number page or color by pattern page.
- b. You may use your choice of colored pencils, markers or crayons to complete your project.
- c. Your completed page must be mounted on a **piece of cardboard** and brought in a **2-gallon bag** for display.

Section 894- Stepping Stones

- a. Stepping stone may be made from concrete or mortar.
- b. Your project may be decorated with inlayed materials or stamped with a design.

A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.


State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence contest (10-11 years), junior state award (12-15 years), senior state award (16-19 years) and group awards (13-19 years). Each application and selection process varies, dependent on the applicant's age.
