A Study on the Impact Factors of Fire Incidents and Identification of Fire Risk Areas in Seoul.

This study explores the factors shaping urban fire risks in Seoul, distinguishing between human-caused and physically-caused fires. Drawing on urban ecology and social disorganization theory, it examines socioeconomic, crime-related, and physical variables at the census tract level. Regression, spatial analysis, and machine learning are used to identify high-risk areas. The findings highlight how social conditions and building characteristics influence fire vulnerability, offering insights for more targeted prevention and urban planning strategies.
