Highlighted things you should know are the following:

- Know sheep breed identifications
- Know body parts of sheep
- Know the wholesale & retail cuts of sheep
- Know how to read a medication label
- Know tools that are used in the care and industry of raising sheep
- Know the main ingredients in sheep feed
- Know external parasites
- Know internal parasites
- Know diseases

Some of the following questions may be asked during the interview process. The answers are from personal experience with your project and/or from the resources listed in the first paragraph.

- 1. What are some of the things that you looked at when choosing your project animal?
- 2. What do you like best about your project animal?
- 3. How much feed are they getting each time you feed them? Do you think that was enough?
- 4. What breed is your project animal?
- 5. Have you dewormed your project animal, and how often should you deworm them?
- 6. What are the tags in their ears used for?
- 7. Can you tell me what the protein level is in your feed?
- 8. What is one thing you learned from this year's project?

It is our hope that you will learn more about sheep in general in this process. There will be a verbal test on this information as well as an interview. Scores will be tallied, and members will be awarded A, B, or C ribbons. Judges will also pick a Best of Show & Honorable Mention award from the combination of the interview and knowledge of the members' sheep project.
