### **Nature Journaling**

### Karen Gourlay, Maybury State Park Interpreter

Join Tollgate gardeners and supporters to learn about and experience Nature Journaling. Journaling about nature can be a fun and creative way to spark curiosity and improve your observational skills. Explore how nature journaling can be an added benefit to annual record-keeping by prompting you to observe your garden more closely, track seasonal changes and interactions, and make comparisons over the years.

Maybury State Park interpreter and former State Park Explorer Program coordinator Karen Gourlay will cover ways to record observations, types of journals and supplies, as well as assorted styles used by other journalers. She will share resources, sample journals, and places to find more information. If you are already keeping a nature journal, feel free to bring it. There will be paper, pens, and other supplies for those who need them to do a warm-up exercise, or you are welcome to bring your own journal or notebook. Please consider bringing a <a href="mailto:small">small</a> item from your garden or nature (seedhead, conifer cone, stone, bark, flower, leaf, etc.) that might be used to practice journaling as time permits.

### PAR Report - Kathryn Fitzpatrick

This is peak planting season. Already we have planted Oldenbor kale, Candy carrots with green onion companions – both pelleted seeds and a strip of Bolero carrot tape seeds, Bridger onions, Zebrune shallots, Cobra and Seychelles pole beans, watermelon radishes, and Rio Grande Verde tomatillos. Next up are 50 lbs. of Kennebec and Red Port seed potatoes which have sprouted nicely, Golden/Straightneck/Nimba zucchini and Caserta summer squash (maybe with companion dill). Whew! But that's not all! Also, flash collard greens, rosemary inside the pole bean trellis, Jalafuego Jalapeno, Altiplano Serrano, and Baron Poblano hot peppers all with companion thyme. Haku and Botran cabbage with companion sage, Gateway cucumbers, and Kossak kohlrabi with companion leeks. Lots of



transplant and direct seed planting, and of course, continuous removal of weeds. The greenhouse transplants have been well managed, and we have benefited from strong, healthy plants.



Along with the planting, we have the never-ending task of weeding. We were fortunate to have a hardy group of DeMaria Construction volunteers join us to weed several beds and pathways. The group also planted three beds of Bridger onions, - Thank You!

We have a serious invasion of Canada thistle in the potato beds we will need to address aggressively – they really bite back, so extra care is needed. The pathways continue to

be overrun by weeds and grasses, despite heavy application of mulch. Again, an ongoing battle to mitigate as much as possible. Weeds always seem to find a way! Happy Spring! Kathryn Fitzpatrick
