Home > Scouting guide> chimera

Variation is the appearance of differently colored zones in the leaves or other plant parts. Chimeral variegation is due to a genetic alteration of a portion of the plant such that it appears different from the rest of the plant. Variegated leaves may resemble virus symptoms.
