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 Field Crops Virtual Breakfest News and Views,

On August 10th, we had the opportunity to host over 175 people at UPREC for an open house style event celebrating our 125th anniversary of service to UP agriculture. The event included presentations, a display of historic photos and artifacts, facility tours and a lunch featuring grass-fed beef and produce from UPREC and other local farms. Many notable partners and stakeholders attended to commemorate our quasquicentennial (125th anniversary) milestone, including those representing MSU AgBioResearch and Extension leadership, MI commodity groups, MI Farm Bureau, the Growing UP Ag Association, other Land Grant Universities and local legislators. One of the highlights was a special tribute from the State of Michigan commemorating our anniversary, presented by the office of Senator Ed McBroom and signed by Senator McBroom, State Representative Jenn Hill, Lieutenant Governor Garlin Gilchrist and Governor Gretchen Whitmer. Although he was not able to attend our open house, MDARD Director Tim Boring and his staff stopped by for a conversation and tour of the facility on Aug 14th, which was a unique pleasure. For 125 years, UPREC has spearheaded research investigating the breadth of UP crops and livestock, and delivered educational programming serving generations of UP farmers and community members. We, the current staff at UPREC, are honored to be part of this deep and meaningful history, and are especially thankful for all of the partners and community members that make our work possible!

Now that the party is over, we want to make everyone aware of an opportunity to share your thoughts about what the next 125 years at UPREC should look like. Over the next few months, we are gathering input from stakeholders to inform development of an updated strategic plan. Your ideas can be shared in two steps/formats, a survey and listening sessions, and we invite you to participate in one or both! The short, twelve-question survey asks you to define current priorities for UP agriculture and consider how UPREC and MSU Extension can respond by adjusting our portfolio of research and outreach programs within the constraints of our perceived institutional strengths and weaknesses. Survey responses will not be associated with any individual and your participation is entirely voluntary. MSU Extension will then facilitate three public and one internal (staff only) in-person listening session across the UP this fall to gather more detailed and nuanced feedback. There will also be an additional online listening session offered, if you would prefer to contribute remotely. A meal will be served at all in-person sessions and there is no cost to attend! However, preregistration is required.

Our goal is to make UPREC as valuable as possible to all stakeholders, with hope that our next 125 years will be as meaningful as the last. Details on how to participate in our strategic planning survey and listening sessions can be found on the next page of this issue.


