Member Spotlight- Cameron James

What are your recent/past 4-H achievements?

One of my biggest 4-H achievements was getting to show/protege a cow at the fair last year. It was a great learning experience and something I'll always be proud of.

How and when did you get involved with 4-H?

I joined 4-H with my sister about six years ago, and it's been a big part of my family's life ever since.

What drew you to being a part of the 4-H program?

I was drawn to the 4-H program because of my family and the farm friends I made, and the chance to try new things. I liked the idea of exploring activities like archery and showing animals, and it turned out to be a good experience."

What have you gained from being a part of 4-H?

Through 4-H, I've learned new skills and had opportunities to grow in ways I never expected.

What advice would you give someone else in 4-H or thinking about joining 4-H?

My advice to someone thinking about joining 4-H is to just try it—you never know if it's right for you until you give it a chance.

What is your favorite memory of 4-H?

My favorite memory of 4-H is the fair and all the fun times we had—especially the harmless pranks we played. It brought everyone closer and made the experience unforgettable.

What are your plans for the future?

I'm not exactly sure what the future holds, but I'm looking forward to finishing driver's training, starting my junior year of high school, and exploring career options by trying out one of the programs at Oakland Schools Technical Campus.

Is there anything else you want to share about yourself, 4-H, or recent experiences that we may include?

I played on the varsity football team this past year, which was a great experience. I'm thinking about playing again next year, and I'm excited to keep challenging myself both in sports and through 4-H.





Volunteer Spotlight- Dena Brown



Where do you volunteer, and how did you get started?

I volunteer in both Wayne County and Washtenaw County. I got started in 1987 when my 8-year-old daughter decided she loved pigs and wanted to show them at the Wayne County Fair.

What has been your favorite or most fulfilling part of volunteering with 4-H?

"My favorite part of volunteering with the youth in 4-H is watching them grow in confidence. It's amazing to see their excitement when they master a new skill, whether it's caring for an animal, giving a presentation, or working together on a project. Being part of those 'lightbulb moments' — when they realize just how capable they are — is what makes volunteering so rewarding for me. Through the Wayne County 4-H protege program the youth who do not have access to farm animals are able to learn and show those animals. This program is how we started in 4-H over 37 years ago."

What volunteer projects do you most like to be a part of?

I love helping 4-H kids learn new things — from making crafts to working with animals to practicing their skills in the Master Stockman program. It's so much fun to see everyone try, learn, and grow!

Do you have any advice for other 4-H volunteers?

"Stepping into a leadership role in 4-H is exciting — and maybe even a little overwhelming at first. The most important thing to remember is that you don't have to know everything. What kids value most is your time, your encouragement, and your willingness to learn right alongside them. Start small, keep activities fun and hands-on, and celebrate every step forward, no matter how small it may seem. Above all, enjoy the journey. You're not just teaching skills — you're helping shape tomorrow's leaders, one meeting at a time."



Success Story

Dog Days of Summer 4-H Camp a Paws-itively Fun Success!

This August, Wayne County 4-H hosted its first-ever Dog Days of Summer Mini Day Camp at the Flat Rock Public Library. It was a tail-wagging hit! Over three days, 16 youth ages 8–14 explored the exciting world of dogs through hands-on learning and activities.

Campers learned about dog breeds, nutrition, grooming, first aid, and careers in the canine world. They played dog breed bingo, made homemade dog treats, acted out first aid scenarios, practiced nail trimming, built enrichment toys, and capped it all off by meeting a professional dog trainer. As one participant shared, "My favorite part was making dog treats and meeting a real dog trainer!"

The camp was designed to give urban youth an accessible way to engage with animals. Youth left with new skills, new friends, and plenty of excitement for future 4-H dog programs. Another camper summed up the fun simply: "It was a lot of fun!"

With such positive energy, Wayne County 4-H looks forward to expanding dog programming and building a sustainable 4-H Dog Program that youth and families can enjoy for years to come. 4-H Online 2025-2026 Enrollment Open! Enrollment is now open for the 2025-2026 4-H Year!

INGREDIENTS

- ½ lb Bacon, cooked and chopped
- 3 Tbs Butter
- 1 Tbs Maple Extract
- 10 oz pkg
 Marshmallows
- 1½ Tbs Maple Syrup
- 6 cups Rice
 Krispie Cereal
- 16 oz Melting Chocolate
- Sea Salt

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Prepare 9x13 in pan with baking spray.
- 2. Melt butter in a large pot over low heat.
- Add marshmallows and stir constantly until fully melted.
- Stir in maple syrup, maple extract, & chopped bacon.
 Remove from heat.
- 5. Stir in Rice Krispies until completely coated in marshmallow mixture.
- 6. Press evenly into baking pan. Don't press too hard





- 7. Melt chocolate in microwave
- 8. Pour chocolate over the Krispies and spread into an even layer
- 9. Sprinkle a little sea salt over the chocolate
- 10. Allow the Rice Krispies to cool completely, then cut into bars.

INGREDIENTS

- 3 Tbs melted coconut oil
- 2 medium acorn squash
- 1½ pounds ground chicken
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 1 small red pepper, diced
- 1 medium carrot, shredded
- 2-3 cloves minced garlic
- 1 large egg
- 11/4 tsp sea salt
- ³/₄ tsp pepper
- 1 tsp dried basil
- 1 tsp dried thyme
- 1 tsp dried parsley
- ¼ ½ tsp red pepper flakes

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F
- 2. Brush 2 Tbs oil on bottom of a baking dish.
- 3. Cut squash in half & remove seeds & pulp. Place in dish.
- 4. Place chicken in a large mixing bowl & set aside.
- 5. Place skillet over med/high heat. Add 1 Tbs oil. When hot, add onion, pepper, & carrot. Cook for 3 minutes.
- 6. Add garlic & cook 1 minute more. Remove from heat and let cool.
- 7. Add the egg, salt, pepper, basil, thyme, parsley, and pepper flakes to the chicken. Then add vegetables. Combine well with your hands, but do not over mix.
- 8. Scoop mix into acorn halves evenly. Bake for 1 hour





INGREDIENTS

- 1lb ground beef
- 1 cup chopped onions
- 1 cup diced potatoes
- 1 cup sliced carrots
- 1 cup shredded cabbage
- 1 cup sliced celery
- 1/4 cup uncooked rice
- 3 cups water
- 1 beef bouillon cube
- 1 tsp garlic salt
- 1/4 tsp basil
- 1/4 tsp thyme
- 1 bay leaf
- 32 oz can stewed tomatoes, undrained

- Brown ground beef and onions in a stockpot.
 Drain excess fat.
- 2. Add remaining ingredients & stir so the tomatoes become slightly mashed.
- 3. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, & simmer for 1 hour.







INGREDIENTS

- 1 lb butternut squash, peeled
- 1 lb carrots, peeled
- 3 Tbs olive oil
- 2½ tsp sea salt
- 1½ tsp black pepper
- 2 Tbs minced chives
- 1 Tbs minced parsley

- 1. Preheat oven to 450°F. Line a baking sheet with parchments paper.
- 2. Cut squash in half & then into slices. Then cut the carrots into slices.
- 3. Places squash & carrots into a large bowl. Add salt, pepper, & olive oil. Toss well to coat.
- 4. Place in a single layer & roast 25-30 minutes
- 5. Add chives and parsley to top.







INGREDIENTS

- 1lb ground chicken
- 2 cups finely grated sweet potato
- 2 Tbs + 1 tsp coconut oil
- 2 Tbs coconut flour
- 1Tbs garlic powder
- 1 Tbs onion powder
- 1 tsp sea salt
- ½ tsp black pepper
- 1 tsp paprika

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F & line baking sheet with parchment paper lightly greased with 1 tsp coconut oil.
- Combine all ingredients in a large mixing bowl, & thoroughly mix
- 3. Begin rolling into small, semi flattened, poppers & place on baking sheet.
- 4. Place in oven for 25-28 minutes flipping halfway through.
- 5. Allow to cool & then serve with your favorite sauce.







INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups almond flour/meal
- 3 eggs
- 2 Tbs melted grass fed butter
- 2T+1/4 cup honey
- 2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1-2 apples
- 1 tsp baking soda

- 1. Preheat oven to 325 °F. Core apple(s) and then blend in a food processor until they are finely chopped.
- 2. Mix all ingredients together, fill muffin cups 3/4 full.
- 3. Bake for 20 minutes



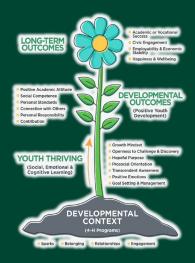
